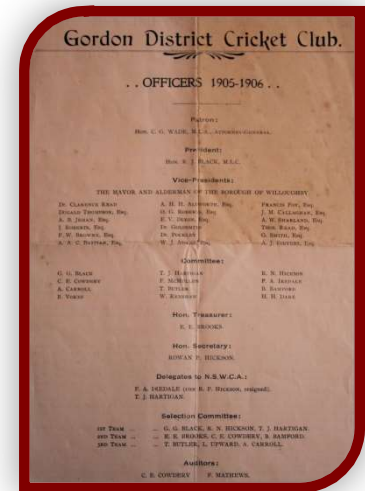

## President's Report

The 2025/26 season was a challenging one for Gordon Cricket Club, both on and off the field.

Our playing results were disappointing. We finished 17th in the club championship and, for the first time in several years, did not have a team qualify for finals. This is clearly below the standards we expect and is something we must address moving forward.

In contrast, it was a terrific season for the Gordon Women's Club, who won both the 1st Grade premiership and the Club Championship. This is an outstanding achievement and credit to the players, coaches and administrators involved.

A major feature of the season was the unavailability of Chatswood Oval due to redevelopment works. This created disruption across both training and meant we also didn't have our normal home ground. However, it was pleasing to have access to Shore facilities during the season, which provided an excellent alternative venue and helped minimize the overall impact. I thank Shore School for their support, and Brett Hunter for his efforts in helping make this arrangement possible.

### Playing Performances

As noted, this was a difficult season from a results perspective. While there were many good individual performances, and most teams were competitive, we did not win enough games.

The highlight was the performance of a very young 1st Grade side. Despite their inexperience, the team competed strongly throughout the season and won some absolute nail biters, and in the end only finished one win outside the finals. The group showed resilience and improvement as the season progressed, and there is clearly a strong foundation to build on in the coming years.

Encouragingly, we continue to see strong representation in NSW age pathways, with three players selected in U19 squads and five in U17 squads. This reflects the strength of our junior and development programs and the pipeline of talent coming through the club. Nick Stapleton was a deserving winner of the Player of the Year award.

Axel Cahlin did an excellent job leading a young 1st Grade side in what was a challenging season. Nick Stapleton will take on the role of 1st Grade Captain next season. Nick is a highly respected member of the playing group and a past premierships captain, and we are fortunate to have someone of Nick's stature to lead our 1st Grade team.

### Coaching

This season marks the end of Elliot Richtor's tenure as Head / First Grade Coach. In his 5 seasons as coach, Elliot has made a significant contribution to our club. We thank him for his commitment and the role he has played in shaping the current playing group.

I would also like to acknowledge Paul McLean, who served as Club Coach this season. Despite the disruption to our training venue and schedule, Paul ensured a strong focus on training and development across the whole club. It is pleasing that Paul will continue his involvement with the club next season.

We have commenced the process of recruiting a new Head Coach. This is an important appointment for the club.

### Facilities and Grounds

With Chatswood Oval unavailable this season, greater reliance was placed on our other grounds. Shore Oval is a magnificent facility and was a pleasure to play some 1st Grade games there. Beauchamp Park was used by 2nd and 3rd Grades and produced very good wickets throughout the season, but the outfield quality was mixed. Killara Oval was problematic. While the wicket itself was generally reasonable, the outfield was very poor for much of the season. In particular, damage caused by dogs continues to be a major issue.

A big thank you to ground staff at each of our grounds. We appreciate your efforts, sometimes in challenging circumstances.

The upgrade of the playing surface and wicket square at Chatswood Oval, represents a significant investment in the future of the club and will deliver long-term benefits. We look forward to being back at Chatswood Oval in season 2026/27

The resurfacing of the cricket nets at Artarmon Reserve is another positive development and will give us access to good local synthetic practice nets.

I acknowledge the support of Willoughby Council in working with the club and Cricket NSW to upgrade cricket facilities in the local area. It is really pleasing to see a council working so constructively with us.

### Clubman of the Year

The Clubman of the Year award was awarded to Ben Woods who has made an outstanding contribution across a range of areas. If there is a job that needs to be done you can count on Woodsy to put his hand up.

The junior Clubman of the year was Fraser Wilson. Fraser's leadership and commitment is outstanding – both on and off the field.

Gordon Women had an outstanding year, claiming the Club Championship in a nail-biting race that went right down to the final round of games. We finished forty-three points ahead of Sydney Cricket Club—a margin that reflects the depth and consistency of our performances throughout the competition. Both 1st Grade and 2nd Grade secured their respective Minor Premierships, and 1st Grade went on to claim the 1st Grade Premiership title. First Grade also made it to the Kingsgrove Cup Semi-Final.

2nd Grade secured the Minor Premiership but suffered a heartbreaking semi-final loss to Sydney Cricket Club. This team has been our most consistent performer over the past four years and thoroughly deserves a premiership — we believe next season will be their year. 3rd Grade contributed this season that will not be forgotten — their last-round win against Sydney University played a meaningful role in securing the Club Championship. This is a team in transition, with six youngsters making the step up from junior to adult cricket under the guidance and mentorship of our senior players, and their ladder position did not reflect how much they gave this year. This is exactly the kind of investment in the future that makes our Club strong, and we look forward to watching this group develop in the seasons to come.

This was a rebuild year for our Brewer Shield squad, with several players moving up to Second Grade. The young Reds narrowly missed the semi-finals by just one game—a result that, while disappointing, speaks to how competitive they were right until the end. We are proud of the character they showed and excited for what this group will achieve as they continue to mature. Congratulations to Blacktown for securing the title.

This season also marks two proud Club milestones — our tenth Club Championship and our eleventh 1st Grade ODI Premiership. These achievements reflect the enduring excellence of Gordon Women's Cricket and the generations of players, coaches and volunteers who have made it possible. As a Club, we have been on a rebuild since our last Club Championship win in 2018/19. This result reflects the hard work, dedication and perseverance shown by our players, coaches and volunteers. Congratulations to all clubs who competed strongly across the competition. The standard continues to rise each season, and despite being displaced while Chatswood Oval was under renovation, and managing several key injuries early in the season, our Club Championship victory was all the more satisfying.

## Financial & Auditors Report

On behalf of the Management Committee of Gordon District Cricket Club Inc (GDCC) I am pleased to report on the financial position of GDCC as at 31 May 2026 and the financial performance of its operations for the year.

For the financial year GDCC reported a statutory profit of \$41,903 (2025 \$4,891).

This year's surplus significantly exceeded the plan and historical average due to the wildly successful luncheon event combined with a disappointing on field season. The luncheon event featuring Lord Ian Botham was attended by four hundred people and returned a surplus greater than the statutory profit and significantly greater than realized in prior years. The Grade club had a disappointing season. Renovation of Chatswood Oval whilst most welcome in the long term meant that the club was only able to field five rather than the usual six grade teams, As the player playing fees only cover a minor portion of the cost, one less team provides a cost saving. On field none of the teams made the finals resulting in an underspend of balls and ground charges compared to budget.

The Junior Club is funded by player playing fees with the objective of achieving a small surplus each season. The Junior Club is proud of its Community Club status and is extremely conscious of the need to ensure that it remains affordable and inclusive. Junior registrations were disappointingly almost 10% lower than in the 2024-25 season.

To keep the Grade playing fees affordable for a largely student playing cohort means that GDCC is heavily reliant on grants from Chatswood RSL Club, Cricket NSW, sponsorship, and fundraising. GDCC continued the arrangement with the Australian Sports Foundation to permit tax deductible donations to be made to the Club.

GDCC remains in a strong financial position with members' funds of \$193,003 (2025 \$151,100) and a significant cash reserve.

This year's surplus adds to the members' funds which have been built over the last ten years. These member funds are now at a level which provides GDCC with adequate working capital, the resilience to survive a poor fiscal year and most importantly funds which can be deployed in conjunction with Willoughby Council and Cricket NSW to bring to fruition infrastructure improvement projects.

The increase in the inflation rate over the past year means that the cost pressures on GDCC will continue. Willoughby Council have indicated that ground hire charges will increase by 4.0% and Ku-ring-gai Council have yet to confirm their increases. Both Councils' longer-term strategy is to increase fees and charges in excess of inflation to compensate for rate pegging.

On behalf of the Management Committee, I would like to acknowledge and thank Cricket NSW, Chatswood RSL Club, the Club's sponsors, supporters who made donations and all those involved in the Lord Botham luncheon for their support of the Club. It would be remiss not to acknowledge those people who chose to support the Club through their involvement in match day management, coaching, and operations.

The financial statements cover Gordon District Cricket Club Inc. as an individual entity. Gordon District Cricket Club Inc. is a not-for-profit Association incorporated in New South Wales under the *Associations Incorporation Act (NSW) 2009 and Associations Incorporation Regulation (NSW) 2010* ('the Act').

The financial report was authorised for issue by the Committee of Management on 01 July 2025.

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

**1 Basis of Preparation**

The Association is preparing special purpose financial statements for the members of Gordon District Cricket Club Inc. for the purpose of fulfilling the financial reporting requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Act (NSW) 2009 and Associations Incorporation Regulation (NSW) 2010* including the Class Order No. 11/01.

The following Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations have been adopted in the preparation of the financial statements of Gordon District Cricket Club Inc.:

AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements

AASB 107 Statement of Cash Flows

AASB 108 Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors

AASB 1048 Interpretation of Standards

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

Significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and are consistent with prior reporting periods unless otherwise stated.

**2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

**(a) Revenue and other income**

Membership fees, sponsorship and coaching grants are recognised in the period to which they relate. Coaching fees are recognised upon the delivery of the service. Sales of goods are recognised at the time of sale to the customer.

Facilities development grants are recognised over the estimated useful lives of the items of plant and equipment for which the grant was received.

Other income is recognised when received.

**(b) Income tax**

The Association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

**2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

**(c) Expenses**

Expenses were recorded in the financial statements on an accruals basis so that expenses are matched against income and recognised in the year to which they relate.

**(d) Facilities development grants**

The Association received facilities development grants from government and sporting organisations to assist with the purchase of depreciable plant and equipment. These grants are recognised as revenue over the estimated useful lives of those items of plant and equipment for which the grant was received.

The portion of the facilities development grants attributable to future financial periods is shown as either a current or non-current other liability on the Statement of Financial Position.

**(e) Goods and services tax (GST)**

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payable are stated exclusive of GST.

Cash flows in the statement of cash flows are included on an exclusive of GST basis and the GST amount that is recoverable or payable to the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) is included in operating activities.

**(f) Inventories**

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Net realisable value is estimated using the most reliable evidence available at the reporting date and inventory is written down through an obsolescence provision if necessary.

**(g) Property, plant and equipment**

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment.

**Depreciation**

Property, plant and equipment, excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the asset's useful life to the Association, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are shown below:

At the end of each annual reporting period, the depreciation method, useful life and residual value of each asset is reviewed. Any revisions are accounted for prospectively as a change in estimate.

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

## Executive Committee Report

### GENERAL - ADMINISTRATION

The Preliminary Rounds of the 1<sup>st</sup> Grade Kingsgrove Sports T20 competition started a week before Round 1 of the main grade competitions and the KST Finals were all finished by the end of October. Unfortunately, the Gordon team lost all four preliminary rounds and did not progress to finals.

Lower grades started on the traditional fourth Saturday in September and played 16 rounds throughout the season. Two-day cricket was again maximized for 1<sup>st</sup> Grade with 3 Saturday/Sunday fixtures, LO matches were generally played in October and December and two-day cricket was played exclusively after returning from the Christmas break until the middle of March.

The use of Shore School's A Ground and practice facilities at Northbridge were greatly appreciated while Chatswood Oval was being renovated. The facilities are generally a class above anything else in Sydney Grade Cricket, albeit that it takes a while to "learn" how to play on such a big field.

1<sup>st</sup> Grade had a strange season. They beat top-of-the-table teams like Mosman, Northern District, St George and Manly during the season but were beaten by Sutherland, UNSW, Sydney and Penrith and missed the Belvidere Cup "play-offs" by only one win.

In other competitions, the Gordon Green Shield and Poidevin-Gray teams did not progress to their respective Finals Series for the first time in several years while, generally, the lower grades underperformed in what can only be described as another disappointing season. The Club has dropped from 6<sup>th</sup> to 13<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup> place on the Club Championship ladder over the past two seasons.

One major positive from the season was that Gordon won the prestigious Spirit of Cricket Award from amongst all of the NSW Men's Premier Clubs. Over the years, Gordon has established a culture of respect for opponents and officials, securing the plaque for the fourth time in the award's 23-year history. Only two other clubs have won it more times than Gordon. However, while maintaining a high standard of sportsmanship, a key objective for the coming seasons is to elevate on-field performances, aiming for more victories across all grades.

Following Tym Crawford's departure to live in the UK, the Club was extremely fortunate to sign up Nick Stapleton from St George where he had played several years of 1<sup>st</sup> Grade as a highly performing all-rounder and Premiership-winning captain. (He won St George's Kerry O'Keeffe Medal for Club Player of the Year on four consecutive occasions and has started his Gordon career successfully winning the Club's Victor Trumper Player of the Year Award this season.)

Nick's 442 runs and 42 wickets saw him selected in the SCA 1<sup>st</sup> Grade Merit Team for the 2025-26 season.

Nick's understanding of the game of cricket is up there with the best across the Premier Cricket spectrum and his assistance to 1<sup>st</sup> Grade Captain Axel Cahlin this season was invaluable. Nick was announced as next year's Captain after Axel stood down from the role at the end of the season. Axel will remain in the team's senior leadership group.

Rory McLean, in his first full season in 1<sup>st</sup> Grade had an excellent season scoring 539 runs at an average of just under 36. Jack Shelley was the second highest run-scorer in the team (453) and his 99 against North Sydney in Round 15 to engineer a recovery from 4 for 23 to post a competitive total of 317, was extraordinary.

Despite several scores in the 90's, for the first time in many years there were no centuries scored in 1<sup>st</sup> Grade this season. This was a telling statistic that resulted in the team never really dominating a game by posting a huge first innings score.

In the bowling department, Nick Stapleton was the "go-to" man and his 42 wickets at 18.62 was outstanding. Matt Wright and Connor Cook were the only other bowlers to take more than 20 wickets while Cal Bladen's troubling hamstring caused him to start the season late and finish early.

Congratulations to our Women's Club on an outstanding season winning the Club Championship in the final round of the season and then, a couple of weeks later, beating the Sydney Cricket Club in a tense Grand Final at Drummoyne Oval to win the 1<sup>st</sup> Grade Premiership.

I complain every year that we have an ever-reducing number of helpers around the Club, especially on match days. We continue to regress in this area each year, albeit that we had a couple of fresh faces this season. We always need MORE volunteers!

Off the field, there were several outstanding successes. The annual luncheon at Dockside in November with special guests Lord Ian Botham and Geoff Lawson, was again enjoyable and financially hugely successful. Funds from the luncheon, another increase in the sponsorship funding from the Chatswood RSL Club, some reduced costs because we didn't play finals cricket and some generous individual donations ensured another solid financial result. Glenn Tullia, who has organized the annual luncheon for 5 or 6 years, has advised that he is stepping down from the Club. Thanks, GT, for your outstanding contribution - it will be sorely missed.

Again, this year's End-of-Season Awards function was held as a relatively informal sit-down dinner at the Greengate Hotel in Killara on 28<sup>th</sup> March. Ben Woods was the main facilitator on the night while Ed Howitt (in absentia) assisted in the organizing of the run-sheet and various trophies and awards for this function. Retiring player, Dave Monaghan, received recognition for his outstanding service to the Club in the lower grades and Cal Bladen again capably performed the role of MC. The Club Player of the Year was awarded to Nick Stapleton while Ben Woods and Fraser Wilson received the Clubman of the Year Awards. It was an enjoyable night for those who attended.

Mark Carmichael again chaired the Club's Cricket Committee with responsibility for recruitment and retention of players, selections, coaching and training. This season, the Selection Committee, headed by Ed Howitt and with Geoff Hickman, Ben Woods, Club Coach Paul McLean and the grade captains, was able to select teams without too many last-minute dropouts. However, the process that allows players to nominate matches in advance that they "need" to miss is far too convenient. Any assertion that a player is committed to being available for every match has all but vanished from Grade cricket. The consequence of this policy, plus

the inevitable injuries that occurred during the season, once again, was reflected in the ordinary performances of the Club's lower grade teams.

A significant majority of the current top-grade players have come via our Junior Development and Country Programs which have been thriving for more than 10 years under the tutelage of Bob Thomas and a contingent of senior players. Talented young cricketers are identified from across Sydney and throughout regional NSW, and introduced to the Club via our Junior Academy, Green Shield and Poidevin-Gray squads. From there, the better ones prove themselves with some good on-field performances and progress into the top grades.

The Executive Committee meets regularly to manage off-field matters and to plan the Club's future. This Committee is staffed exclusively by volunteers while many other clubs in Sydney employ a paid "General Manager" or "CEO" to do the ever-increasing workload required of a Premier Cricket Club.

Executive Committee Members:

- Geoff Keevers - G.O.A.T. (Greatest of all Treasurers)
- Jim Wright, as Director of Communications, continues to provide fresh and current posts for the Club's website and social media platforms. He and Tony Wilson provide regular high-quality photos for the Club's Facebook and Instagram pages and also, on occasions, for promotional material for Cricket NSW.  
Frogbox is used for live streaming of all 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade, PG's, Green Shield and Brewer Shield home matches. Matches can be watched on YouTube or via CA's PlayCricket App with links to PlayHQ live-scoring. Jim uses an associated software package called Lilypad to publish highlight packages onto our social platforms.
- Ben Woods, as our Director of Facilities, continues to achieve some success applying for various Local and State Government grants for upgrades to our facilities at our grounds. Ben and Club President, Michael Cant, now have an excellent working relationship with Willoughby Council. As a consequence of this, we lost the availability of Chatswood Oval last season while the outfield was completely re-laid with the new Tahoma 31 variety of couch grass and the wicket square laser-levelled and re-laid with Legend Couch grass. It is now hoped that the Rugby Club doesn't trash the oval during the winter.  
Ben also continued on the Club's Selection Panel and was awarded the Clubman of the Year Award at the recent Presentation Night.
- Scott Hinton continued as a Director on the Executive Committee. Scott does a great job each season booking grounds for Gordon male and female teams plus Junior club and North Shore regular and Rep matches so that our grounds are fully utilised.
- Grant Robinson had the unenviable, thankless, unappreciated responsibility of Club Operations, made even more difficult by the fact that we didn't have our home ground, Chatswood Oval, available this season. He arranged for the erection of black sightscreens at Shore School's A Ground for each of the 8 playing days there and also at Beauchamp Park for white ball matches.
- Glenn Tullia did another enormous job with the Annual Luncheon in November with Special Guests, Lord Ian Botham and Geoff Lawson. For several years, the Luncheons organized by GT have been fundamental towards keeping the Club on the positive side of the ledger. However, Glenn has recently given notice that he wishes to step down from all club responsibilities. He will be sorely missed as will another Director, Leigh Brezler, whose allegiance has transferred to a club, which will remain nameless, to our north where her son is now playing.

- Finally, my thanks go to (Hon. Assistant Secretary) Jim Cattlin and (former Comms Director) Paul Stephenson for their considerable work in collating and publishing this Annual Report.

## SYDNEY CRICKET ASSOCIATION & CRICKET NSW

### NSW MEN'S PREMIER CRICKET

Cricket Central at Silverwater is now established as the “hub” of cricket in NSW. Stage 2 of the development at the facility was opened prior to the start of the 2025-26 season offering team facilities (change rooms, player and support staff seating, function/meeting rooms, etc.) adjacent to the main playing field.

Work on a second “junior” playing field and outdoor synthetic practice nets is underway while approvals for lighting at the main ground are being finalized. The 2025-26 Men's 1<sup>st</sup> Grade Finals were played on the main ground during the past season along with several Sheffield Shield, WNCL, Australia A and other high-profile matches. Unfortunately, spectator facilities and seating around the main ground remain somewhere between sparse and non-existent.

Gordon and Cricket NSW Life Member, Marshall Rosen, is further reducing his involvement in cricket matters in the State. He remains on Board Subcommittees for Life Membership and Wilson Park (“Cricket Central”) Development.

Andrew Falk fills the role as the Club's Delegate to Cricket NSW and also as one of the Delegates to the Sydney Cricket Association where he has now completed 24 years on the SCA's Committee of Management. Club Director of Cricket, Mark Carmichael, is the Club's other (Men's) Delegate to the SCA while Catherine Pittaway is the Delegate from the Women's Club.

The Australian Cricketers' Association (ACA) continues to provide generous financial support for Male and Female Premier Clubs across Australia by funding an ACA Member to coach and/or play for that club. This season, Matthew Nicholson was the recipient of this funding as our “senior” Green Shield Coach.

The Cricket NSW Integrity Unit has taken over Judiciary matters from the old SCA Code of Conduct Commissioner. There is now a system in place across all cricket in NSW where any reported matter, on or off field and including player or club official behaviour, racial vilification, Working With Children issues, etc. is handled by this Unit. It works independently of the clubs but it is felt by many to be handing down lenient penalties for many on-field discrepancies.

Sean Mantle took over the Premier Cricket Competition Management at Cricket NSW two years ago. Sean's service to, and communication with, the clubs is outstanding and he also does an excellent job as Secretary of the Sydney Cricket Association in support of the SCA's Committee of Management.

In my annual report on 1<sup>st</sup> Grade Afternoon Teas, I can only say that I am looking forward to getting back to Chatswood Oval! While it was only necessary to provide teas on 4 playing days this season (all at BISP), the need to take everything to any venue that is not our own is hard work and not recommended for any club that does not have an abundance of volunteers!

The Cricket Australia competition administration and management system called PlayHQ is now four seasons old. This system, despite a few drawbacks, is now a usable and reliable system. A majority of Premier Cricket matches in Sydney throughout the grades are live-scored into the PlayHQ system and these scores appear along the bottom of the screen when a game is live-streamed via Frogbox.

Finally, Premier Clubs continue to be greatly appreciative of the significant funding that is provided by long-term sponsors, McDonalds, Kookaburra and Kingsgrove Sports and, for a fourth season, we enjoyed a generous sponsorship arrangement with Gage Roads Brewing.

A summary of recommendations will be communicated to clubs once this is finalized in advance of the Female Premier Cricket Forum to be held in late May.

At this stage there will be no changes to the structure of Women’s Premier Cricket in 2026/27 to allow clubs time to plan for the implementation of recommendations in season 2027/28.

As mentioned above, Catherine Pittaway, from Gordon’s Women’s Club, is Delegate to the Sydney Cricket Association while also sitting on the SCA’s Women’s Competition Sub-committee.

## Cricket Report

### Introduction

Season 2025/26 was in some respects successful but by most measures it was extremely disappointing. Gordon fielded 5 grade teams but did not field a Metropolitan Cup team. This was primarily due to a shortage of grounds owing to Chatswood Oval being unavailable.

The club did not contest any of the 9 competition finals, which was particularly disappointing.

That said there were highlights during the season, in particular the progress of a number of young players who were given an opportunity to play higher grades. It is hoped that experience for those players will lead to an improved season next year.

### On Field Performance:

As indicated, the on-field season was extremely disappointing. A 17<sup>th</sup> place finish in the Club Championship, with no teams contesting finals confirms that the club did not compete strongly during the season.

**First Grade:** While there were some strong individual performances during the year, a lack of consistency proved decisive. Wins over top ranking teams were followed by losses to teams lower on the table.

**Second Grade:** The 2<sup>nd</sup> grade team finished 19<sup>th</sup> which was a great disappointment, as much more was expected from this team.

**Third Grade:** Challenged strongly after Christmas however the team finished 13<sup>th</sup> on the table.

**Fourth Grade:** Played some bright cricket in particular during the first half of the season but were not able to maintain their form post-Christmas and finished 12<sup>th</sup>.

**Fifth Grade:** A 20<sup>th</sup> place on the ladder appears disappointing however this team suffered most from the regular and often late withdrawals from the higher grades and did well to compete as strongly as they did.

**Poidevin-Gray:** The competition was a mix of 50 over and T20 games which presents both opportunities and challenges for the players. The team had a reasonable season playing some good cricket at times, and finished 7<sup>th</sup> in their pool.

**A W Green Shield:** The team finished 15<sup>th</sup> on the table and performed very well at stages during the season. The loss of 3 players to higher representative honors during the season impacted heavily on the team's performance.

### Club Championship

Gordon finished 17<sup>th</sup> out of 20 clubs in the Club Championship. This was unfortunately well short of our goal of a top 10 finish and will be a point of focus for next season.

### Coaching

Paul McLean took over as Head Coach from Elliot Richtor and did an excellent job. Elliot was First Grade coach and did a very good job. The players were supported by a number of specialist coaches,

namely Ash Squire (batting), Julian Stephenson for the second half of the season (fast bowling) and Brett Rosen (wicket keeping). Terry Howes unfortunately suffered a back injury early in the season which meant he was not able to continue while Brett Hunters' availability was limited due to his other commitments. The club places great emphasis on the coaching made available to the players and a sincere thank you to all the coaches for their contributions.

Connor Hindmarch and Matt Nicholson did a wonderful job as coaches of the A W Green Shield team and are to be congratulated on helping develop this young group of players. A note of thanks to Bob Thomas for his ongoing work in relation to the Academy and Green Shield, it is valued by all.

## Communication Report

The club communicates internally to players and supporters, primarily through TeamApp, which may be downloaded onto a smartphone via the AppStore or Google Play.

Most of our players attended one of the sessions and were photographed in a variety of poses with bat or ball. These photos proved useful throughout the course of the season when significant individual achievements were recognised.

## Grants & Infrastructure Report 2025-26

The Club's Executive Committee continues to prioritize key infrastructure projects to support improved playing and training facilities for our members.

### Artarmon Reserve Nets

Following the successful completion of Stage 1 (expanded net structure), further upgrades to the Artarmon Reserve Nets are scheduled to commence in early June 2026, with works expected to be completed by the end of June 2026. The \$130,000 project will include extension of the run-up area and resurfacing of the entire area with new synthetic grass to Cricket Australia standards. This work will greatly enhance the quality and usability of the training facility.

Looking ahead, Council has expressed a strong commitment to investigate the construction of a roof over the Artarmon Reserve Nets, which would enable a fully all-weather training facility at an estimated cost of around \$500,000. A Development Application (DA) is anticipated to be submitted in FY2027, with construction works targeted for FY2028.

Cricket NSW has also indicated a strong interest in supporting this major project, recognizing its value to player development and community cricket, especially on the lower North Shore.

### Chatswood Oval

Significant progress has been achieved at Chatswood Oval, with the playing surface upgrade now completed. The \$600,000 project has delivered:

- New outfield drainage
- Installation of new turf
- Major renovation of the wicket square

These improvements represent a substantial uplift in playing conditions and will benefit our Club greatly.

The Club continues to work closely with Council, Gordon Rugby and other stakeholders on longer-term plans for further enhancements at Chatswood Oval, including future upgrades to player amenities and pavilion infrastructure.

Pleasingly, Council is proposing to set aside funding to support design and construction of re-developed/upgraded facilities with design to commence in 2027/28 and construction proposed to commence in 2028/29

### Other Infrastructure Priorities

The Club remains committed to advancing additional priority projects, including:

- Refurbishment of Chatswood Oval sightscreens (circa \$80,000)
- New retractable nets system for the practice wickets at Chatswood Oval (circa \$50,000)
- Advocacy for upgraded change room and pavilion facilities at Chatswood Oval (\$10m +)

These projects will require ongoing collaboration with Council, Cricket NSW, and relevant funding bodies.

## First Grade Report

The 2025/26 season was a mixed bag for First Grade. We finished 11th in the Belvidere Cup, winning seven games, and were agonisingly close to a finals berth, one extra win resulting in fifth place. Gordon finished 13th in a tightly contested One Day competition and were unfortunately winless in the T20s.

In patches, the First Grade side played some excellent. We had a number of debutants this season, most of whom were young talents who will no doubt have very successful careers for the Stags. They included Angus Parsons, an athletic fast bowler who is more than capable with the bat; Viv Ghandi, a highly skilled leg-spinner/batsman; Aryan Gupta, an exciting all-rounder with exceptional skills with the ball; Rory McLean, a keeper/batsman who made his mark with a breakout season; Toby Robinson, a young top-order bat who displayed some strong performances in his first year of senior cricket; Jaylen Johnston, a top-order bat and left-arm spinner who performed excellently and showcased his potential; and last but not least, Nick Stapleton, who came from St George and showed us why he is one of the best cricketers in the competition, adding immense value in terms of both knowledge and leadership.

The season started with the T20s and, despite being winless, there were some excellent performances and a couple of close games that could have gone either way. Against Western Suburbs, Rory began his First Grade career with a blistering 53\* off 25 balls, while Nick racked up a tidy 2/21 off four overs, bowling the difficult overs in the Powerplay and surge. Unfortunately, some excellent batting from a strong Wests line-up applied pressure, and they were able to chase down our total of 176 in the final over. It was a similar story later that day as we travelled to Blacktown. On a very slow wicket, we posted 7/120, with Nick anchoring the innings with 55\*. The spin duo of Matt Wright and Viv took 1/26 and 0/17 off their four overs respectively, while Nick was again the standout with 2/16. However, Blacktown were able to score heavily off the occasional over and chased our total down with seven balls to spare.

The following weekend, our match against Easts was high scoring as they posted 206. Bryce Cook was able to take two key wickets, while Matt, Nick and Viv took one each. However, Easts displayed some excellent power hitting to reach a formidable total. In reply, Gordon got off to a flying start, applying pressure to the opposition and looking on track to chase it down, with Axel scoring 58 off 24 balls and Jack Shelley showcasing his excellent skill and ball-striking with 32 off 21. Consistent wickets fell, however, and we were eventually bowled out for 170 in the 18th over. A loss to Parramatta in the final match brought an end to our T20 campaign, but a powerful cameo from Viv, hitting 29\* off 17, stood out, while our spinners again showed their class, with Connor Cook, Matt and Viv all taking wickets with good economy rates. Aryan Gupta also played an important role in this game, taking his maiden First Grade wicket while bowling the toughest overs of the game at the death.

The season then moved into the limited-overs competition and, despite a slow start, the team showed glimpses of what we were capable of during the T20s and were keen to get on the board for the year.

We were away from Chatswood this year due to renovations, with Northbridge becoming our home ground for the season. The wickets tended to be slow and, in our first game against Sutherland, our spin trio of Matt, Viv and Connor led the way. Stapo showed his consistency with another outstanding performance as we bowled them out for 164. On a difficult wicket, Mitch Lole and Stapo got us off to

a great start, scoring 47 and 42 respectively, but the loss of wickets in clumps had us in trouble. A loss looked likely at 9/136, but a final partnership between Matt and Bryce slowly chipped away at the total. We came agonisingly close but ultimately fell short, being dismissed for 163 after 42 overs. Despite the result, the fight and determination displayed by the playing group was pleasing to see.

It was a similar story the following week as we took on UNSW at Northbridge. Some inconsistent bowling allowed them to score 261 on a deteriorating wicket and, despite a wonderful 77 from our returning overseas player Joe Pocklington, who was ably supported by Jack and Connor with 39 and 37 respectively, we were bundled out for 215.

Moving into the two-day matches, Stapo took over the captaincy in Axel's absence and won the toss — a great start. Drummoyne has a generally spongy outfield and, with a good covering of grass, Mitchell and Joey Gillard knuckled down, scoring 47 and 33 respectively to set up a nice platform. Rory again showed his talent with a well-composed 93\* and was unlucky to miss out on a century, but we were bowled out for 270 and had a couple of overs at them overnight. Callum Bladen stole the show, snaring two wickets in a short spell, and we were well on top heading into Day 2. An excellent innings from Sydney overseas player Louis Kimber proved the difference, however, as they were able to chase our score eight wickets down shortly after tea.

It would be over the next couple of rounds that the First Grade side really found its feet and put together the performances we all knew we were capable of. We travelled out to Hawkesbury and, after a washout on Day 1, returned the next day and were asked to bat on a difficult pitch. Excellent counter-attacking innings from Jack (26) and Connor (75) got us to 201 and we needed 10 wickets in around 60 overs for victory. Our spinners stole the show, in particular Joe Pocklington, who grabbed five wickets. The following week, we found ourselves at Hurstville and, on a flat wicket, produced one of our best team bowling performances of the season. Once again, our spinners led the way, bowling in great partnerships and applying constant pressure. We bowled them out at tea and were chasing just over 200. It was a tricky period to manage, but some aggressive batting from Axel (74) put us on the front foot and we finished the day's play two down for more than 100 runs. Stapo anchored the innings with a composed 70 and we passed the total with ease — a victory I'm sure he will remember for a long time against his former club.

Something worth mentioning was the level of enthusiasm and skill in the field during these two games. Every player showed commitment and athleticism that was no doubt a key factor in helping us dominate.

The next stretch of games involved two last-ball thrillers which saw us come away with victories. We travelled to Mosman and the self-proclaimed champ, Stapo, brought fielders in for the final ball of the game and shattered the stumps to win us the match. It was one of the most enjoyable victories I have been a part of, and his courage and composure proved the difference. Retrospectively, the game was so enjoyable that we decided to do it again the following week. At 9/162 chasing 227, victory seemed out of reach, but Matt and Callum had other ideas. They slowly chipped away at the score while taking the odd boundary as the total quietly built. We passed 200 and momentum was with us. Both players handled the pressure superbly and held their nerve to get us over the line in what was one of the best 10th wicket partnerships I have witnessed. I cannot praise them highly enough and they should be incredibly proud of their efforts. I can also assure you that Callum has requested to be considered an all-rounder for next year's Stags Fantasy team.

After a disappointing loss to Penrith, we came up against Manly. After winning the toss and bowling, a couple of early wickets from Callum and Mitchell had us on top at 2/29. A solid partnership from Ahillen Beadle and ex-Stag Charlie Stobo gave Manly the momentum until Matt and Stapo combined beautifully to take two and four wickets respectively, both with very tidy economy rates. Manly finished 9/201, which was a tough yet achievable score on the wicket. Mitchell anchored our innings beautifully with a gutsy 25, where he saw off Stobo and limited his impact. Rory controlled the middle overs with a wonderful 60\* to hand us victory and put us in a strong position heading into the Christmas break.

With only a handful of games post-Christmas, three wins from the remaining five games would see us crack the top six. A washout against Parramatta and a disappointing outright loss to Bankstown had us on the back foot with three games remaining. We travelled to Blacktown Int. Sports Park to take on a strong Western Suburbs outfit and managed 261 on a wicket that played tougher than it looked. Mitchell (79) and Stapo (21) handled the new ball terrifically to put us in a strong position at lunch. Rory (55), Jay (26) and Connor (46) showcased a fantastic balance of patience and aggression to help build a competitive total. The next day, we lost almost half the day to rain and needed 10 wickets in 55 overs. Despite an early partnership from Wests having them at 2/123, constant pressure was applied and there was an unwavering self-belief that saw us consistently take wickets. Joe and Stapo were the pick of the bowlers, taking three wickets each, and Wests were dismissed for 225.

The following round saw us take on arch-rivals North Sydney away from home. We were sent in on a green seamer and, at 4/23, momentum was well and truly with the opposition. Jack (99) and Rory (65) counter-attacked, smacking the ball to all parts of the ground and quickly putting us back on top. Despite falling short of a well-deserved century, Jack's innings was a joy to watch and he showcased his incredible skill, making a difficult wicket look like the M1. Jay continued to build our momentum, notching up a maiden half-century and demonstrating composure rarely seen in someone of his age. We were eventually dismissed for 317 in only 64 overs and, with a couple of hours left to bowl, some early wickets would establish a brilliant platform for victory the following week. Unfortunately, Callum went down with a hamstringing injury, leaving us a bowler short, but Luke Jacobs stepped up with a mammoth effort. He steamed in, swung the ball and was relentless with his line and length, taking a wicket and applying significant pressure at one end. The day finished at 3/64 and the game remained in the balance. The following Saturday, the wicket offered some turn and bounce, which our spinners took full advantage of. Joe and Connor took three wickets each, ripping through North Sydney and dismissing them before lunch. With 10 points on offer, the follow-on was enforced and more quick wickets had them reeling at 7/84. Despite having to wait for his opportunity, Matt Wright did not disappoint, bowling his first over of the game in the second innings and collecting a double-wicket maiden. What was the captain thinking waiting this long?! The wicket had flattened out and, with North Sydney batting for the draw, chances were difficult to create. We fell two wickets short of an outright win but could take enormous confidence heading into the final round.

With a win required to make finals and Randwick standing in our way, we travelled to Coogee in the early hours of the morning to ensure there was enough time to parking. A batting collapse had us dismissed for 80 and it looked like our season was all but over. We fought hard with the ball but struggled to take wickets, and Randwick built a lead of nearly 200. They declared and had a crack at us, but Mitch and Toby Robinson comfortably saw us through to the end of play against what I would say was the most dangerous pace attack in the competition. The following week, a brilliant 95 from

Mitchell and strong support from Axel (46) and Connor (59) helped us to 266 and a slender lead of around 70. Matt Wright bowled outstandingly and took three wickets, but our lead was simply not enough and our season came to an end shortly after.

Despite the disappointing result, the season showed a great deal of promise. The talent and skill were clear to see, our self-belief grew and we were able to handle pressure moments much better than in previous years, which was very pleasing and something we will continue to work on. I'm looking forward to seeing what this team can achieve in the future.

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## Second Grade Report

One of the standout moments of the season was our comprehensive win over last season's premiers. There were several standout team performances across the year. In Round 1, Gordon secured a thrilling last ball victory over Campbelltown, chasing 157 to finish 7 for 159. Alex Cutting played a match winning innings of 34 not out from 25 balls, including 3 4s and a 6, while Jay Naganayagam provided the foundation with an excellent 46. Round 5 delivered our most dominant victory of the season, with Gordon posting 4 for 254 before dismissing Hawkesbury for 157. Jaylen Johnston blasted 88 from just 42 balls, while Toby Robinson produced a remarkable unbeaten 106 from 51 deliveries to guide the side to a commanding 79 run win. Another memorable performance came in Round 8 against Mosman. Although Gordon narrowly fell short after posting 252, the match featured a superb century from Jaylen Naganayagam, who struck 103 from 75 balls, well supported by Tom Connolly's composed 40 from 67 deliveries.

A number of individual performances stood out throughout the season. Alex Cutting's boundary from the final ball against Campbelltown secured our opening round victory and remains one of the highlights of the year. Luke Jacobs produced an outstanding bowling performance against UNSW, claiming 6 wickets for 32 runs from 8 overs. Toby Robinson's explosive unbeaten 106 (6x7, 4x7) against Hawkesbury and Jamie Bekis compiled an excellent 118 (6x5, 4x13) from 130 balls against St George. Jaylen Naganayagam's brilliant 103 (6x5, 4x11) from 75 balls against Mosman showcased his attacking ability. In Round 13, Alex Cutting delivered a marathon innings of 158 (6x2, 4x21) from 185 balls. Jaylen Johnston also demonstrated his all-round value against Sydney, scoring 76 from 84 balls before bowling 22.2 overs and taking 4 wickets for 104 runs.

## Third Grade Report

The 2025/26 season saw Gordon 3rd Grade finish 13th out of 20 teams, with a record of 6 wins, 7 losses, 1 draw, and 2 washouts. While this placed us in the lower half of the table, the season was far more competitive than the ladder suggests. A number of close matches, along with victories against eventual top six sides, showed that the group was capable of matching it with the better teams in the competition.

We started strongly with back-to-back wins against Campbelltown-Camden and Sutherland, which set a positive early tone. However, we were unable to build on that momentum and went through a challenging period without a win for a number of rounds. Despite this, the group remained competitive, and later in the season we were able to turn things around. In Round 9 we had a narrow loss to Northern District, who went on to win the competition, which highlighted our ability to compete with the very best sides. Following this performance, the group took confidence into the second half of the season and, from December onwards, secured a number of strong victories against eventual top six sides, including Penrith, Manly Warringah, and Western Suburbs.

We learnt to stay in the game for longer periods and withstand pressure from the opposition, which significantly improved our performances in two-day cricket after Christmas. A great example of this was our hard-fought draw against Bankstown in Round 13, where we recorded our two highest individual scores of the season. A dazzling 138 from Vivaan Gandhi and an effortless 108 from the evergreen Max Newman for a 200 run 5th wicket partnership helped set a strong total of 8/330 declared. While Bankstown survived Day Two to finish nine wickets down — despite a lion-hearted effort from Tom Haytack (5/35 off 18 overs) — the match laid a blueprint for how we wanted to approach our two-day cricket moving forward. We followed this up with a dominant win against UTS North Sydney at Bon Andrews, bowling them out for 81 in the first innings and securing the points halfway through Day One with only three wickets down.

From an individual perspective, our batting group showed strong depth throughout the year, with multiple players contributing consistently, particularly Rahul Krishna (283 runs @ 31.44) and Ryan Tullia (261 runs @ 37.29). With the ball, Shreyan Deshpande (19 wickets @ 20.74), Nicholas Audet (17 wickets @ 17.59), and Thomas Haytack (13 wickets @ 11.54) led the attack and played a crucial role in restricting a number of top six sides to modest totals in matches we went on to win. Significant contributions were also made throughout the season by a number of emerging players, including Cooper Pullen, Harrison Valenzisi, Vivaan Bhosale, and Nick Stanwell, all of whom will continue to improve with another season of grade cricket under their belts.

From a captaincy perspective, the attitude and behaviour of the group was a real positive throughout the season. The team consistently approached games with the right mindset and maintained a strong culture regardless of results. Given the significant amount of unavailability across the club this season, we really had to adopt a “squad” or next-man-up mentality. Across the 16 rounds, 42 players represented Third Grade, and I’m extremely grateful for how well everyone bought into the standards we set as a group — particularly the importance of fielding, competing hard for each other, and enjoying our time both on and off the field together.

I thank the coaches, the Gordon committee, and all volunteers who supported us throughout the season. Their contribution to the club is invaluable and greatly appreciated by all players.

Looking ahead to next season, the focus will be on building on the lessons learnt throughout the ups and downs of this year, while continuing to keep the same close group of players together. With the ability shown throughout the season and the continued development of the group, there is a strong foundation to build on and push towards an improved ladder position next year.

## Fifth Grade Report

Further Mathew Brown made the most of his opportunities with 94 runs at 23.50, before injury hampered the back half of his season. Manas Bansal also contributed a valuable 134 runs throughout the season with his quick hitting also leading to opportunities in 4th grade. Further, Ashwin Sathiyaseelan produced an innings of 74 to bring us our 2nd victory of the year.

While Jack Osborn had a slim start to the season, he cashed in during the later games, finishing 235 runs, including a highest score of 61. I was fortunate enough to share a few significant partnerships with him and these will be innings I remember for years to come.

Ronnie Singh, an up-and-coming prodigy, contributed with 168 runs throughout the season, top scoring in the final game with 67 runs, a testament to his ongoing efforts to improve. Veraj Singh, Lokesh Ravikumar, Archie Hall, and Damon Wilkie all played important supporting roles, regularly stepping up when needed. And although Matthew Fahy fell out of some form during the season his commanding 41 in a challenging run chase, brought us our first win of the season at Beauchamp Park. Further, Kishna Dhawan and James McDaniel often contributed in pressure situations. Ashwin Sathiyaseelan was a genuine workhorse throughout the season, bowling 44 overs and taking 12 wickets at 18.17, consistently providing control and breakthroughs. Oscar Patterson also contributed strongly with 5 wickets at an excellent economy of just 3.0 runs per over. Stuart Peters and Ronnie Singh both played valuable roles with the ball, while Archie Hall shouldered the biggest bowling workload of the season, delivering 77.5 overs and finishing with 9 wickets.

Kishna Dhawan, Damon Wilkie, Jack Osborn, James McDaniel, and Aarya Vignesh all contributed important overs across the season, often stepping up when the team needed them most. The bowling unit worked hard and often performed better than the results reflected, with fielding lapses at times making life harder for our attack than it should have been.

Fielding remained an area of mixed results. At our best, we were sharp, energetic, and capable of saving crucial runs and taking difficult chances. Players such as Ronnie Singh, Mathew Fahy and Archie Hall consistently set strong standards in the field. However, improving our consistency in the field will remain one of the key focuses heading into next season.

Further, a special thanks needs to be given to Mathew Fahy who also captained the 5th grade side during the season. Your efforts were greatly appreciated and the standards you brought improved individual players and subsequently enhanced the quality of our team.

One of the strongest parts of the season was the team culture and spirit within the group. The boys played hard, competed well, and continued to support each other throughout both the highs and the frustrations of the season. Even during difficult periods, the side maintained strong energy and upheld the Spirit of Cricket, representing Gordon with pride both on and off the field.

The changing of personnel in the 5th grade team definitely presented challenges, however, I am super proud of how the boys showed up every week and competed. A sincere thank you goes to all those who supported the side throughout the year. ## A.W. Green Shield Report

### Round 1

Gordon 10-192 def. by Parramatta 9-218

Everyone was excited for the first Greenies game of the season, at home vs Parramatta with 7 returning players from the 24/25 season and 8 new players welcomed to the Gordon squad.

After a wicket in the first over to Charlie Chippendale with the batsmen beaten for pace, Parra then got off to a flyer with some big hitting and were 1/52 after 7 overs. Enter debutant Joel Pagano who changed the game with a wicket with his first ball (and finished with 4-21). Gordon had wrestled the momentum back with quick wickets and by the midway mark Parra were 4-100. Parra unfortunately consolidated with late overs partnerships and finished with 9/218 - a strong score on a good deck but a slow Beauchamp outfield.

Time for Gordon to chase - After an early wicket, Aarav Ahluwalia (60 off 73) and Cooper Williams (40 off 55) put on an impressive 101 run partnership to have Gordon 2/114 after 21 overs. The batting was both elegant and powerful with Gordon upbeat.

Parra's barrage of spinners however bowled exceptionally well and rarely missed their length in the middle overs, steadily taking wickets throughout the innings and building pressure. After losing 3 for 8, Sean Twining (38 off 70) and Charlie Chippendale (25 off 41) combined for a steadying 46 run partnership in the middle, however the tight bowling and flow of wickets meant Gordon needed 42 off the last 8 overs with 4 wickets in hand. We were unfortunately bowled out 26 runs short.

It was a tough loss given the momentum shifts during the game and knowing that beating Parra would have provided a very strong platform to make the knockout stage. Nonetheless a first round loss had not prevented Gordon's strong performances in the past 2 years.

### Round 2

Gordon 7-282 def. Penrith 10-231

After a rest day the boys headed to Howell Oval to play Penrith in scorching conditions. Winning the toss, we elected to bat and an aggressive approach and impressive shot making from George Harris (47 off 65) and Aarav Ahluwalia (26 off 19) got Gordon off to a cracking start with the team 1/78 after 15 overs.

Cooper Williams (91 off 83) batting at no. 3 was exceptional in the heat putting on a batting masterclass with shots all-round the ground, both into and over the fence, combined with quick running between the wickets. He was well supported by Sean Twining (54 off 47) who continued the run a ball rate until roughly the 40th over where we were 3/240. We weren't quite able to capitalise on the final 10 overs with the Penrith attack claiming multiple wickets as we looked to accelerate. Nonetheless Gordon had set a formidable target of 282 with Tanush Lokray unbeaten on 21 off 26 at the innings close.

After a slight delay due to the heat, Gordon's bowlers ripped through the Penrith top order. At the 14th over Penrith were 4/48 and we were hoping for an early mark but that wasn't to come as Penrith's middle order were resolute in defence albeit never really challenging the required run

rate. Our bowling attack shared the wickets across the group including Archie Hetherington (2/26) and Joel Pagano (2/24) with two each. In the end Penrith were bowled out for 231 in the final over with a solid win to Gordon.

### Round 3

Gordon 7-197 def. UNSW 7-196

Round 3 saw Gordon matched against UNSW who were leading the competition having only lost 3 wickets in the demolition of their first two opponents.

Winning the toss and electing to bowl the Gordon boys were up for the contest. It was a tight tussle with Gordon restricting the runs but UNSW having wickets in hand at most points. In the 9 overs from over 7 to 15 inclusive Joel Pagano (3/16 off 8) and James McDaniel (1/30 off 9) held UNSW to 9 runs with Scotty Boland like accuracy building pressure that ultimately led to wickets during the second half. At the mid-way mark UNSW were 2/74 and while they looked to accelerate at multiple points our accurate bowling and supportive fielding contained the runs, restricting UNSW to 7/196. The bowling group again combined well with both pace and spin delivering crucial wickets.

Achieving the total was going to require some solid batting and Aarav Ahluwalia (61 off 116) provided exactly the innings required. While aggressive early, Aarav changed strategy after we were 3 down to anchor the innings. When Charlie Chippendale (53 off 64) came to the crease, Gordon needed 110 off the remaining 24 overs to win. Charlie and Aarav were making it look easy to the frustration of UNSW and combined for a 79 run partnership. However, UNSW were to fight back and quickly claimed 3 wickets leaving Gordon with a nervous task of 29 off the last 6 overs. Archie Hetherington's (14\*) six over mid-on in the 47th over was a highlight that released the building pressure, and Tanush Lokray hit the winning runs with 5 balls to spare.

A fantastic match reflecting the quality of Greenies cricket and a great win heading into the New Year break.

### Round 4

Gordon 10-115 def. by Manly 1-116

The New Year started with Round 4 v Manly at Manly. Missing four players at Representative carnivals (Charlie Chippendale, Sean Twining and Cooper Williams at the National U17 Carnival in Brisbane and Braiden Ball at Bradman Cup) and illness also impacting, it was always going to be a tough ask. However, these absences also present opportunity. With Captain Aarav winning the toss and having a bat, Jasper Grainger contributed 15 runs on debut. Veraj Singh (19) and Ronnie Singh (14) both fought hard and Arjun Shankar top scored with 24\* to get us to 115.

Unfortunately, aside from another early wicket to Joel Pagano (1-18) we couldn't get going in the field with Manly comfortably chasing down the total for the loss of only 1 wicket. A tough day which presented plenty of learning for a young team.

### Round 5

Gordon 3-253 def. by Fairfield Liverpool 5-259

We headed to Fairfield-Liverpool's Rosedale Oval, the 2023 Premier Cricket ground of the year. A gorgeous ground with a significant outfield. Gordon bowled first, and FLCC made their intentions clear from the outset, batting and running aggressively between wickets. James McDaniel his usual economical self (1-40) with Archie Hetherington (1-49) and the leg-spinners Aarav (1-48), George Harris (1-32) and Braiden (1-37), the wicket takers in FLCCs innings of 5-259.

A measured start from Jasper (19) and Aarav (122) saw Gordon take a mature approach to assessing the large outfield and increasingly overcast conditions in the chase. Following George Harris (86\*) joining Aarav at the crease a partnership of the highest quality ensued. Both boys consistently hit the ball into gaps, ran hard and dispatched bad balls to the boundary with authority. As conditions deteriorated and rain continued to fall the umpires brought the players off with 35 overs done and Gordon slightly ahead on DLS. Unfortunately, our rain dances were ineffective and play resumed, with Aarav reaching his 100, an innings of truly the highest quality. With rain falling and the pitch condition getting even worse we pressed on. Unfortunately, we fell 7 runs short of what would have been a famous victory. A phenomenal effort from Aarav and George to get us so close in extremely tough conditions.

### Round 7

Gordon 10-240 def. by Eastern Suburbs 6-241

In the final round game against Easts at Waverley Oval we needed a win and a handful of results to go our way to make the knockout stage.

Batting first we got off to a great start with Aarav (31 off 47) and George Harris (24 off 39) continuing their form from Fairfield. After 15 overs we were 2-64, a strong platform for Cooper Williams (107 off 87) and Sean Twining (55 off 54) to accelerate. And accelerate they did with a 130 run partnership at more than a run a ball to have Gordon at 3-194 with 17 overs remaining. Coopers' innings was glorious - including 4 sixes and 7 fours and an array of shot making. Unfortunately, one of East's spinners decided to put a massive dent in Gordon's plans for 300, taking 6 wickets in his 7 overs to bowl Gordon out for 240 with 5 overs remaining.

We opened the bowling with some impressive pace from Charlie Chippendale (1 for 47) who had the batsmen ducking and weaving and ultimately collected the first wicket after 19 runs. The next wicket was a while off however with East's batting very aggressively to be 2-173 in the 29th over. Archie Hetherington (2 for 53) sparked a late mini collapse to be on a hat trick and along with Joel Pagano (2 for 28) helped Gordon secure 5 wickets to have Easts 6-208.

Unfortunately, we weren't able to break the next stand with Easts number 3 finishing unbeaten on 145\* and hitting the winning runs in the 45th over.

While the team wasn't able to make the knockout stage the boys enjoyed the Greenies competition and will no doubt continue to improve with the learnings from the campaign.
